Spending Time with Our Lord

In this Sunday's Gospel we hear about the arrival of Our Lord and His disciples at the house of the sisters Martha and Mary in Bethany. Our Lord was very well received by them but Martha was distracted with much serving, and became very preoccupied with the small details. Mary, on the other hand, sat down at Our Lord's feet and listened to Him speak. Martha complained to Jesus that Mary was leaving all the work to her causing Our Lord to give Martha a gentle rebuke. "Martha, Martha, you worry and fret about so many things...It is Mary who has chosen the better part; it is not to be taken from her." So Our Lord is telling Martha He would be much happier with *her* if she too spent the time with Him rather than running all over the house! This could be translated into Our Lord will be much happier with **us** if we spend time in prayer with Him each day as well as doing good, rather than being someone who spends the whole day running around and not spending any time in prayer at all. In fact He describes Mary as not only doing the better part, but as doing the **one thing necessary**. Elsewhere in the Scriptures, Our Lord insists on the **primacy** of prayer: "Pray always" (Lk.21:36).

Last Monday we celebrated the Feast of St Benedict, the Founder of the Benedictines whose motto is "*ora et labora*", "*prayer and work.*" Priority should be given to time spent in prayer and we will probably find we work better after having done so. We might find it difficult to spend a long period in prayer, but it is not so difficult to raise our minds to God countless times a day for a minute or two. If we make an effort to spend time with Jesus in prayer, we grow in grace and holiness and we will be much better off afterwards. Time spent in prayer is always worth the effort!

NEW 'FEAST' OF ST MARY MAGDALENE: Pope Francis decreed last month that from now on the *memorial* of St Mary Magdalene which we celebrate on 22nd July be raised to the dignity of a liturgical *Feast* which makes her equal with the Apostles. St Mary Magdalene was the Apostle to the Apostles since she announced to them the Resurrection, and they, in turn, announced it to the whole world. The Vatican has said it is thus fitting that the liturgical celebration of St Mary Magdalene should have the same rank as that of the Apostles. In practical terms, this means we will now recite the Gloria at Mass on her feast day.

LOUGHBOROUGH TOWN OF SANCTUARY (LTOS) is a small group of volunteers whose main role is to provide a welcome to asylum seekers who come into Loughborough to register at the Home Office Centre opposite the Beehive car park. In addition to a smile and some words of welcome the volunteers, who stand outside the Centre, can offer a drink and a snack from John Storer House. The money for this comes from fund-raising and donations. During the summer, with the schools closed, there is an increase in the number of young children who accompany their parents to the Centre. LTOS tries to provide small gifts for these children. Contrary to popular opinion, asylum seekers do not receive large benefit payments from the State. Many of them depend on charity including local food banks for their wellbeing. If you could donate a small gift for these children, please leave it at the back of the Church near the Carpenter's Arms box. Gifts that would be acceptable would include small outdoor toys, art and craft materials (for children up to 11) and soft toys, in good condition, for those under 3. I will collect any donations at the end of the 11.00am Mass for the next few weeks. *Frank Fay*
