RECONCILIATION SERVICE: This will take place this **Monday 15th April** at 7pm and there will be several priests available to hear Confessions. The normal scheduled times for Confession are Saturdays 10-11am and 5.30-5.55pm and Sundays 10.30-10.55am. The Sacrament is also available on request and at Mount St Bernard's Monastery every day 2.30pm-3pm. The Church requires us to confess our sins at least once a year (CCC#1457), and we should take this seriously. Christ suffered and died for our sins in His Passion and then rose from the dead on Easter Sunday. We go to the cross in the confessional, and rise again renewed after unloading our sins. Let God give you that joy so as in the words of the Gospel He can say to you, "Go and sin no more." Fr Paul

Psalter Week 2

The Holiest of All Weeks

We are now in **Holy Week** - the holiest of all weeks in the Church's year, and we begin it by recalling Our Lord's triumphant entry into Jerusalem on **Palm Sunday**. Later in the week we will be with Him as He institutes the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and the Priesthood on **Maundy Thursday**. We will also be with Him as He sweats blood during His agony in the Garden of Gethsemane, His arrest and trial, the scourging and crowning with thorns, and the terrible journey on the *Via Dolorosa* which will culminate in His suffering and dying on the cross on **Good Friday**. The Sacred Liturgy makes all these events present to us.

But today (Palm Sunday), while on the one hand we are joyous as Our Lord enters Jerusalem and the people hail Him as the Messiah and Redeemer, we will also be sad as we read the Passion where He is rejected and put to death. This is the **paradox**, because what seems to be Our Lord's defeat is actually His victory. His love conquers death. He proved to us beyond any doubt that God's love for us has no limits, and by His obedience to the Father, the disobedience of Adam is reversed, and by His paying the price of our sins which was the cause of His suffering, our friendship with God is restored, and the gates of Heaven are once again open to us. So we have great joy even amidst the greatest of sorrows.

JESUS wants to come into your heart this Holy Week. On Palm Sunday He entered *Jerusalem* on a *donkey*. This week He wants to enter *your heart* in the *Sacred Liturgy* which makes all these events present to us. So let's strive to make this Holy Week really different from other weeks, by turning off the TV, our computers and mobile phones more than usual. Let's give something extra to God and make the effort to attend the Holy Week ceremonies which are both solemn and moving as we live through these events of our Redemption. And why not bring someone else with you? Perhaps someone who is searching for God or someone who has been away from the Church for a long time? Your invitation could be the gentle prod they need. You could be the means God wishes to use to either help them find Him or return to Him. I wish you all a very blessed and spiritually fruitful Holy Week.

GOOD FRIDAY: A reminder to you that Good Friday is a day of **fasting and abstinence**. According to the Code of Canon Law, this means Catholics who are 18 years old and up, until their 59th birthday (when you begin your 60th year), are bound to fast (1 full meal and perhaps a little food at a couple of points during the day). Also, all Catholics who are 14 years and older must abstain from meat. I would also recommend making a good Confession if you have not done so already. There will be a priest available for Confessions after Stations of the Cross on Good Friday evening.

DURING MASS AT THE EASTER VIGIL Frances, George and James, who have been on the RCIA programme, will be received into the Church, confirmed and make their First Holy Communion. Please pray for them and also for Nupur, who on the same day will be baptised in India.

<u>CHILDREN'S STATIONS OF THE CROSS</u>: This will take place, as usual, on Good Friday, 19th April at 10am in the hall.

EASTER GRUB CLUB will be open on **Monday 15th and Tuesday 16th April**, 11.30am until 1pm. Only one week as most state schools return the day after Easter Monday.
