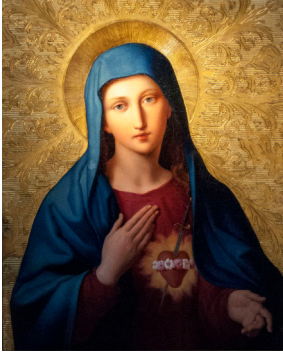

**This is the month dedicated to Mary's love for all of us – let's celebrate it!**

**A**ugust is the month dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, and **this August is an especially fitting time for us to find strength in this devotion**, as we handle constraints and stress stemming from war and conflict in Ukraine, rising prices of everything, the Covid 19 virus still around and worries for us all as Autumn and Winter draw nearer.

**So, what better time is there to run to our spiritual Mother?** We should never keep our distance from her and are always safe in her arms. Our Lady of Fatima famously said, *"In the end, my Immaculate Heart will triumph."* She also said, *"Don't lose heart ... My Immaculate Heart will be your refuge and the way that will lead you to God."* We can put our anxieties aside by resting in Mary's Immaculate Heart. The **Memorare** reminds us: *"Inspired by this confidence, I fly unto you, O Virgin of Virgins, Our Mother."*

**This month let's fly to our Mother's Immaculate Heart.** To help you do that, why not:

**Remember the first five Saturday's devotion.** This devotion is also called the **Act of Reparation to the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary.** It was requested by Our Lady of Fatima. For five months in a row, on the first Saturday of the month, you make an act of reparation to Mary by receiving Communion, praying the Rosary, keeping Mary company for another 15 minutes by meditating on the Mysteries, and going to Confession within 8 allotted days. If you are reading this after 6th of August, mark your calendar and resolve to start next month! It's a beautiful devotion that never fails to produce rich rewards.

**Pax Christi:** At this time we remember the devastation caused in Hiroshima and Nagasaki when the atomic bombs were dropped, on 6 and 9 August 1945, and we pray that nuclear weapons will be abolished so that they can never be used again. In his message, 'A Culture of Care as a Path to Peace', Pope Francis asks, 'How many resources are spent on weaponry, especially nuclear weapons, that could be used for more significant priorities such as ensuring the safety of individuals, the promotion of peace and integral human development, the fight against poverty, and the provision of health care'. In this country we have an active Catholic peace movement in Pax Christi.
