We proclaim your Death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection until vou come again.

When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup. we proclaim your Death, O Lord, until you come again.

Save us. Saviour of the world. for by your Cross and Resurrection you have set us free.

The Priest concludes the Eucharistic Praver saving alone:

Through him, and with him, and in him, O God, almighty Father. in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honour is yours, for ever and ever. The people acclaim: Amen.

The Communion Rite

The Priest invites all to join in the Lord's Prayer:

Our Father, who art in heaven. hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation. but deliver us from evil.

The Priest continues alone:

Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant peace in our days, that, by the help of your mercy. we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress. as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours now and for ever.

The Priest says:

Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles: Peace I leave you, my peace I give you. look not on our sins. but on the faith of your Church. and graciously grant her peace and unity in accordance with your will. Who live and reign for ever and ever. Amen. The peace of the Lord be with you always. And with your spirit.

The Deacon, or the Priest, adds: Let us offer each other the sign of peace.

The Priest takes the host and breaks it.

Meanwhile the people say or sing:

Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us.

Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, grant us peace.

The Priest shows the host to the people and says: Behold the Lamb of God,

behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.

The Priest or other minister says to each communicant:

The Body [Blood] of Christ.

Each communicant answers: Amen.

The absolution by the Priest follows. The people reply:

Amen.

If the 'Kyrie, eleison' has not been said or sung, it is said or sung now.

I tell you solemnly, you will not get out till you have paid the last penny.

['You have learnt how it was said: You must not commit adultery. But I say this to you: if a man looks at a woman lustfully, he has already committed adultery with her in his heart.] If your right eye should cause you to sin, tear it out and throw it away; for it will do you less harm to lose one part of you than to have your whole body thrown into hell. And if your right hand should cause you to sin, cut it off and throw it away; for it will do you less harm to lose one part of you than to have your whole body go to hell.

'It has also been said: Anyone who divorces his wife must give her a writ of dismissal. But I say this to you: everyone who divorces his wife, except for the case of fornication, makes her an adulteress; and anyone who marries a divorced woman commits adultery.
