And the people continue, acclaiming one of the followina:

We proclaim your Death. O Lord. and profess your Resurrection until you come again.

Or

Save us, Saviour of the world, for by your Cross and Resurrection you have set us free.

The Priest concludes the Eucharistic Prayer

saving alone: Through him, and with him, and in him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holv Spirit. all glory and honour is yours, for ever and ever.

The people acclaim: Amen.

The Communion Rite

The Priest invites all to join in the Lord's Prayer:

Stand

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us: and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

The Priest continues alone:

Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant peace in our days. that, by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress. as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours now and for ever.

The Priest says:

Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles: Peace I leave you, my peace I give you, look not on our sins. but on the faith of your Church, and graciously grant her peace and unity in accordance with your will. Who live and reign for ever and ever. Amen.

The peace of the Lord be with you always. And with your spirit.

The Deacon, or the Priest, adds: Let us offer each other the sign of peace. The Priest takes the host and breaks it.

Meanwhile the people say or sing:

Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us. Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world.

have mercy on us. Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world,

grant us peace. Kneel

The Priest shows the host to the people and savs: Behold the Lamb of God.

behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb. Lord. I am not worthv that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word

and my soul shall be healed.

The Priest or other minister savs to each communicant: The Body [Blood] of Christ. Each communicant answers: Amen.

hymn or canticle of praise may be sung. Praver after Communion

And, striking their breast, they say:

through my fault, through my fault. through my most grievous fault:

therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

Or

Have mercy on us. O Lord. For we have sinned against you. Show us, O Lord, your mercy. And grant us your salvation.

Or:

You were sent to heal the contrite of heart: Lord, have mercy. Or: Kyrie, eleison. Lord, have mercy. Or: Kyrie, eleison.

You came to call sinners: Christ, have mercy. Or: Christe, eleison, Christ, have mercy. Or: Christe, eleison,

You are seated at the right hand of the Father to intercede for us: Lord, have mercy. Or: Kyrie, eleison. Lord, have mercy. Or: Kyrie, eleison.

The absolution by the Priest follows. The people reply: Amen.

If the 'Kyrie, eleison' has not been said or sung, it is said or sung now.

The Gloria

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will.

We praise you, we bless you, we adore you. we alorify you. we give you thanks for your great glory. Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father.

Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son. Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us: you take away the sins of the world. receive our praver: you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

Let me sing to my friend the song of his love for his vineyard. My friend had a vinevard on a fertile hillside. He dug the soil, cleared it of stones, and planted choice vines in it. In the middle he built a tower, he dug a press there too. He expected it to vield grapes. but sour grapes were all that it gave.

And now, inhabitants of Jerusalem and men of Judah, I ask vou to judge between my vineyard and me. What could I have done for my vinevard that I have not done? I expected it to yield grapes. Why did it yield sour grapes instead?

Verv well. I will tell vou what I am going to do to my vineyard: I will take away its hedge for it to be grazed on. and knock down its wall for it to be trampled on. I will lav it waste, unpruned, undug: overgrown by the briar and the thorn. I will command the clouds to rain no rain on it. Yes, the vineyard of the Lord of hosts is the House of Israel. and the men of Judah that chosen plant. He expected justice, but found bloodshed, integrity, but only a cry of distress.

The word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

Psalm

Ps 79:9.12-16.19-20. R. Is 5:7 R) The vineyard of the Lord is the House of Israel.

You brought a vine out of Eqypt: to plant it you drove out the nations. It stretched out its branches to the sea. to the Great River it stretched out its shoots. (R)

Then why have you broken down its walls? It is plucked by all who pass by. It is ravaged by the boar of the forest, devoured by the beasts of the field. (R)

God of hosts, turn again, we implore, look down from heaven and see. Visit this vine and protect it, the vine your right hand has planted. (R)

And we shall never forsake you again: give us life that we may call upon your name. God of hosts, bring us back; let your face shine on us and we shall be saved. (R)

Matthew 21:33-43

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people, 'Listen to another parable. There was a man, a landowner, who planted a vineyard; he fenced it round, dug a winepress in it and built a tower: then he leased it to tenants and went abroad. When vintage time drew near he sent his servants to the tenants to collect his produce. But the tenants seized his servants. thrashed one. killed another and stoned a third. Next he sent some more servants, this time a larger number, and they dealt with them in the same way. Finally he sent his son to them. "They will respect my son" he said. But when the tenants saw the son, they said to each other, "This is the heir. Come on, let us kill him and take over his inheritance." So they seized him and threw him out of the vineyard and killed him. Now when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?' They answered, 'He will bring those wretches to a wretched end and lease the vinevard to other tenants who will deliver the produce to him when the season arrives.' Jesus said to them, 'Have you never read in the scriptures:

It was the stone rejected by the builders that became the keystone. This was the Lord's doing and it is wonderful to see?

'I tell you, then, that the kingdom of God will be taken from you and given to a people who will produce its fruit.'

THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

The offerings are brought to the altar. A hymn may be sung.

If the Priest savs the two pravers of offering aloud the response both times is: Blessed be God for ever.

The Priest completes additional personal preparatory rites, and the people rise as he says: Pray, brethren (brothers and sisters), that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God. the almighty Father.

The people reply:

May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.

Prayer over the Offerings

Accept. O Lord, we prav. the sacrifices instituted by your commands and, through the sacred mysteries, which we celebrate with dutiful service. graciously complete the sanctifying work by which you are pleased to redeem us. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you. And with your spirit. Lift up vour hearts. We lift them up to the Lord. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right and just.

The Priest continues with the Preface and concludes with the people, singing or saving aloud: Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest. Kneel

The Eucharistic Prayer continues until the priest says: The mystery of faith.

Sit Stand

All bow
